Securing the Privileges of the People.

Paffed by the General Affembly of the Representatives of the Freemen of the State of VERMONT, at their Seffion at Bennington, February 11th, A. D. 1779.

A N D

An Act for fecuring the general Privileges of the People, and establishing Common Law and the Constitution, as Part of the Laws of this State.

FOR ASMUCH as the free Fruition of fuch Liberties and Privileges as Humanity, Civility, and Christianity call for, as due to every Man, in his Place and Proportion, without Impeachment and Infringement, bath been, and ever will be, the Tranquility and Stability of Churches and Common- Preamble: wealths; and the Denial or Deprival thereof, the Disturbance, if not Ruin of botb:

E IT ENACTED, and it is bereby enacted by the Representatives of the Freemen of the State of Vermont, in General Affembly met, and by the Authority of the same, That no Man's Life shall be taken away; no Man's Honor or good Name stained; no

Man's Person shall be arrested, restrained, banished, difmembered, nor any Ways punished; no Man shall be deprived of his Wife or Children; no Man's Goods or Estate shall be taken away from him, nor any Ways indamaged, under Colour of Law, or Countenance of Authority; unless it be by Virtue of some express Law of this State, warranting the same, established by the General Assembly; or in Case of the Defect of fuch Law in any particular Cafe, by fome plain Rule warranted by the Word of GOD. THAT

No Man's Perfon or Property to be damaged, but by Law.

### Forming and regulating the Militia.

An Act for forming and regulating the Militia; and for Encouragement of Military Skill, for the better Defence of this State.

**B**E it enabled, and it is bereby enabled by the Repreferitatives of the Freemen of the State of Vermont, in General Alfembly met, and by the Authority of the fame, That the Governor of this State, for the Time being, fiall be Captain General and Commander in Chief; and the Deputy-Governor for the Time being, fhall be Major-General, of and over all the military Forces within the fame.

THAT all the military Companies in this State, shall be formed into Regiments, as tolloweth, viz.

THAT the military Companies in the feveral Towns included in the Limits hereafter defcribed, viz. Beginning on the Weft Bank of Connecticut-River, where the fame enters into the State of the Maffachufetts-Bay; from thence up faid River to the Northeaft Corner of the Township of Weftminster; thence Weft by the Needle of the Compass, to the County Line; thence Southerly on faid Line, until it comes to the North Line of the Maffachafetts-Bay aforefaid; from thence Easterly on faid Line, to the Place of Beginning, be, and are hereby made and declared to be one entire and diffinct Regiment; and shall be diffinguished and called by the Name of the First Regiment.

THE military Companies in the feveral Towns and Gores included in the Limits hereafter defcribed, viz. Beginning at the Southwest Corner of the Township of *Pownal*; from thence Northerly in the Line of this State, to the Northwest Corner of Arlington; thence East a parallel Line, until it strikes the County Line; thence Southerly on faid County Line, until it comes to the North Line of the State of Massachusetts-Bay; thence Westerly on faid Massachusetts Line, to the Place of Beginning, be, and is hereby made and declared to be one entire and distinct Regiment; and shall be distinguished and called by the Name of the Second Regiment.

THE military Companies in the feveral Townships and Gores included in the Limits hereafter defcribed, viz. Beginning at the Northeast Corner of the Township of Westminster, on Connecticut-River, and running Northerly up faid River, to the Southeast Corner of the Township of Norwich; thence Westerly on the Southerly Lines of the Towns of Norwich and Sbaron, and to continue the same Course to the County Line; thence Southerly on faid Line, until it comes to the Northwest Corner of the First Regiment; thence Easterly on faid Line, to the Place of Beginning, be, and is hereby made and declared to be one entire and diffinet Regiment; and shall be distinguished and called by the Name of the Third Regiment.

THE military Companies in the feveral Townships and Gores included in the Limits hereafter described, viz. Beginning at the Southeast Corner of the Township of Norwich, on the West Bank of Connetticut-River; thence running Northerly on said River, until it comes to the Forty-fifth Degree of Northern Latitude; thence West on said Line, until it comes to the County Line; thence Southerly on faid County Line, until it comes to the Northwest Corner of the Third Regiment; thence Easterly on the North Line of faid Third Regiment, to the Place of Beginning, be, and is hereby made and declared to be one entire and distinct Regiment. # ACTS AND LAWS.

## Forming and regulating the Militia.

THE military Companies in the feveral Townships and Gores included in the Limits hereafter described, viz. Beginning at the Northeast Corner of the Second Regiment; from thence running Northerly on the County Line, until it comes to the Forty-fifth Degree of North Latitude; thence running West on *Canada* Line, until it comes to *Lake-Champlain*; then turning Southerly on the West Line of this State, until it comes to the Northwess Corner of the Second Regiment; thence running Easterly with the North Line of the Second Regiment, until it comes to the first-mentioned Bounds, be, and is hereby made and declared to be one intire and diffinct Regiment; and shall be diffinguished and called by the Name of the Fifth Regiment.

THAT where, by the aforefaid Division, or by any Division which shall be hereafter made, it shall so happen that any of the said military Companies shall be divided, and put Part into one Regiment, and Part into another Regiment; in such Case, such Company or Companies shall belong to that Regiment, to which the major Part of the Company doth belong.

THAT there shall be in each Regiment, from I ime to Time, appointed by the Soldiery and Freemen within the same, a Colonel, Lieutenant-Colonel, and Major, who shall be commissioned by the Governor of this State for the Time being.

THAT the Colonel, or Officer commanding in each Regiment, as often as he shall see Cause, shall require the Captain, or chief Officer of each Company in his Regiment, to meet at such Time and Place as he shall appoint, to confer with them, and give in Charge such Orders as shall by them, or the major Part of them, be judged meet, for the better ordering military Affairs, and promoting military Skill and Discipline in said Regiment.

AND the faid Colonel, Lieutenant-Colonel, and Major of each Regiment, are hereby impowered to dignify the feveral Companies belonging to their respective Regiments, calling to their Affiftance the commissioned Officers of the respective Companies of said Regiment.

And be it further enalited by the Authority aforefaid, That all male Perfons, from Sixteen Years of Age to fifty, fhall bear Arms, and duly attend all Multers, and military Exercife of the refpective Troops and Companies, where they are inlifted, or do belong, except Minifters of the Gofpel, Counfellors, Juffices of the Peace, the Secretary, Judges of Probate, and Superior and Inferior Courts, the Prefident, Tutors, and Students at Collegiate Schools, Mafters of Arts, allowed Phyficians and Surgeons, Reprefentatives or Deputies for the Time being, School-Mafters, Attornies at Law, one Miller to each Griff-Mill, Sheriffs and Conftables for the Time being, conftant Jury-men, Tanners who make it their conftant Bufinefs, lamed Perfons, or others difabled in Body, producing a Certificate thereof from two able Phyficians or Surgeons, to the Acceptance of the two chief Officers of the Company whereto the Perfon feeking Difmiffion appertains, or of the chief Officers of the Regiment to which fuch Company belongs.

THAT every lifted Soldier and other Householder, shall always be provided with, and have in conflant Readiness, a well fixed Firelock, the Barrel not less than three Feet and a Half long, or other good Fire-arms, to the Satisfaction of the commissioned Officers of the Company to which he doth belong, or in the Limits of which he dwells; a good Sword, Cutlass, Tomahawk or Bayonet; a Worm, and Priming-Wire, fit for each Gun; a Cartouch-Box, or Powder-Horn and Bullet-Pouch; one Pound of good Powder;

## ÁCTS AND LÀWS.

### Forming and regulating the Militia.

Powder; four Pounds of Bullets fit for his Gun, and fix good Flints; on Penalty of Eighteen Shillings, for want of fuch Arms and Ammunition as is hereby required; and Six Shillings for each Defect; and a like Sum for every four Weeks he shall remain unprovided : That each Company shall chuse some suitable Person to be Clerk; who shall be sworn to the faithful Discharge of his Office, before some Counsellor or Justice of the Peace, which Oath shall be administered in the Words following, viz.

The Oath.

Clerk to be chosen and

fworn.

You — — do folemnly fwear by the everliving God, that you will faithfully execute the Office of Clerk of the military Company of Foot, commanded by Captain — — until another shall be chosen and sworn in your Room; and will do equal Right and Justice to all Men, to the best of your Judgment and Abilities, according to Law. So help you God.

To attend and call the Roll.

Clerk's daty.

Penalty for neglect.

To execute warrants for fines.

FieldOfficers to call their Regiments together, &c. AND every Clerk fo chosen and sworn, shall give his Attendance in the Field, with his Sword by his Side, on every of the muster or training Days, by his Captain or chief Officer appointed, to call over the Roll of the Soldiers, and to take Notice of their Defects, by their Absence or otherwise.

AND every fuch Clerk shall take an exact List of all the Soldiers within his Limits, twice in every Year at least, and deliver to the Captain or commanding Officer of the Company of which he is Clerk, a true Copy of fuch List twice in every Year if thereto required; and also deliver a true and exact Account of the Number of Officers and Soldiers contained in his List, to the Colonel or chief Officer of the Regiment to which faid Company belongs, attested by him as Clerk, some Time in the Month of April annually, and oftner if by such chief Officer required; on Penalty of forfeiting the Sum of Ten Pounds for every such Neglect, to the Use of the Company to which he belongs: which Fine shall be levied by Distress and Sale of the Offender's Goods, by Warrant from the chief Officer of faid Company, directed to the Constable of the Town in which faid Clerk dwells.

AND every fuch Clerk is hereby authorifed and required to execute all lawful Warrants, by his fuperior Officers to him directed, and for the levying any Fine or Fines on Delinquents, together with neceffary Charges arifing thereon; being by Virtue of fuch Warrant as fully impowered thereto as Conftables are in other Cafes, and fhall have the fame Fees, and fhall account for fuch Fines to the chief Officer of the Company whereto he belongs.

THAT the Colonel or chief Officer of each Regiment, shall be, and is hereby impowered and authorised, upon any Claim, Invasion, or Notice of the Appearance of an Enemy, either by Water or Land, to affemble in military Array, and put in warlike Posture, the whole Militia of the Regiment under his Command, or such Part of them as he shell think Needful; and being so alarmed, to lead, conduct, and employ them, as well within the Regiment whereto they belong, as in any other adjacent Place in this State; for the affiiting, securing, and relieving, any of the Subjects of the United and Independent States of *America*, or their Forts, Towns, or Places, that shall be affaulted by any Enemy, or in Danger thereof; and with them, by Force of Arms, to encounter, repel, pursue, kill and deftroy such Enemy, or any of them, by any fitting Ways, Enterprizes or Means whatsoever.
