يو ئور COPIES of the Laws which have been adopted and published in the Territory of the United States north-welt of the River Ohio, from the commencement of Government to the 31ft day of December, inclusive—made out from the original Records in the Secretary's Office, and to be transmitted to the Secretary of Congress, agreeably to the Ordinance of the thirteenth of July, one thousand feven hundred and eighty-feven.

CHAPTER I.

A LAW for regulating and eflablishing the MILITIA in the Territory of the United States north-west of the river Ohio, published at the city of Marietta upon the twenty sifth day of July, in the thirteenth year of the Independence of the United States, and of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty eight, by his Excellency Arthur St. Clair, Esquire, Governour and Commander in Chief, and by the Honourable Samuel Holden Paisons and James Mitchell Varnum, Esquires, Judges.

LL male inhabitants between the age of Alimale in fixteen and fifty, fhall be liable to and habitants, ec. liablet perform military duty, and be formed into militiaduty corps in the following manner.

Sixty four rank and file shall form a com-how to b pany. Eight companies shall form a battalion. ^{organized} Two battalions shall form a regiment.

There shall be appointed to each company, one captain, one lieutenant, one ensign, four ferjeants, four corporals, one drummer and one fifer. To a battalion there shall be appointed, one lieutenant colonel, one major, and one adjutant. To a regiment one colonel.

The corps shall be divided into senior and to be class junior classes.

And whereas in the infant state of a country, defence and protection are absolutely effential,

all male inhabitants of the age of fixteen and upwards, fhall be armed, equipped and accoutred in the following manner;

how to be accoutred,

With a mufket and bayonet, or rifle, cartridge box and pouch, or powder horn and bullet pouch, with forty rounds of cartridges, or one pound of powder and four pounds of lead, priming wire and brufh and fix flints.

And whereas for fecuring the principles of and when to affemble; defence and protection, it is neceffary to be affembled upon certain times, and at certain places, for examining and infpecting the arms and accoutrements, and for disciplining the men in a foldierly manner: And whereas the affembling of the members of community at fixed periods, conduces to health, civilization, and morality; and fuch affembling without arms in a newly fettled country, may be attended with danger; Therefore the corps shall be paraded at ten o'clock in the morning of each first day of the week, armed, equipped, and accoutred as aforefaid, in convenient places next adjacent to the place or places already affigned, or to be affigned for public worfhip : at other times and places, the corps shall be paraded for mufter, exercife, and review as the commander in chief may direct. And whereas in the prefent fate of the territory it is neceffary that guards be established; the commander in chief, and the commanding officers of counties, and of fmaller diffricts shall make fuch detachments for guards and other military duty as the public exigencies may in his, or their opinion require.

how to be claffed; Those who have born commissions, civil or military, in the fervice of the United States, or either of them, and who have been honorably discharged therefrom, and all such as have

v been graduated in colleges or universities, shall how to be compose the fenior class. Males above the age classed ; of fifty fhall be liable to military duty in cafes of actual invation only, and then at the direction of the commander in chief. Officers of exemptions. civil government appointed by Congress or commissioned by the Governour are exempted from the duties aforefaid.

If any male inhabitant shall neglect or refuse Fine for neto appear at the fixed times and places of pa- gleding the rade by this law established, he shall be fined duty enjoined by in the fum of twenty five cents, unlefs he shall this act. render an excufe to the fatisfaction of the commanding officer of his corps. If any male as aforefaid shall neglect or refuse to appear at such time and place as the commander in chief shall fpecially direct, for multer, review, and exercife, he shall be fined in the sum of fifty cents, unlefs excufed as aforefaid.

If any male as aforefaid shall neglect or refule to appear upon the order of the commander in chief, or other officers as aforefaid, for guards or other ordinary military duty, or refule to perform the fame, he shall be fined in the fum of one hundred cents-which offences shall be Fines how . heard and determined by the officers of the to be detercompany to which the offender may belong, mined and collected. and upon conviction, a warrant of diffres shall iffue from the commander of fuch company, directed to either of the ferjeants of the fame, requiring him to collect the fines aforefaid, and pay the fame into the treasury of the town, city or county wherein the conviction shall have taken place, within twenty days next after iffuing fuch warrant. For the fecond, and all fucceeding offences in the cafes before mentioned, the perfons charged with having committed the fame, shall be heard, tried and sentenced by courts-martial.

If any male inhabitant as aforefaid, fhall ne-On neglect of duty in glect or refuse to appear and perform his duty cafe of invafion, &c. under the orders of the commander in chief. against an enemy invading the territory, or shall refuse, difobey or neglect the orders given by his officers, or any of them, in time of action, he shall be deemed guilty of cowardice and defertion, and be heard, tried, and fentenced by a court-martial.

Duty of officers;

All officers shall be attentive to the forming, difciplining, parading, and commanding their respective corps, and to such other duties as thall respectively bind them by this law, and by the orders from time to time to be given by the commander in chief.

If any officer shall be guilty of a breach of how to be tried on ne- this law, or in any refpect violate, or neglect glect therehis duty, he shall be heard, tried, and sentenced of. by a court-martial.

A court-martial shall confift of not more than Court-mar. tial how thirteen members, nor lefs than five, whereof constituted; one at leaft shall have rank superior to that of

A court-martial shall be appointed by the appointed & commander in chief, or the commanding officers of a regiment or battalion; but the commander in chief only shall have the power of approving and carrying into effect fentences of courts-martial, whereby the punishment shall be capital, or an officer cafhiered.
