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Militia.

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For Regulating of the Militia.

HEREAS for the Honour and Service of Their Maicities, and for the Security of this Their Province against any Violence or Invasion whatever; It is necesfary that due care be taken that the Inhabitants thereof be Armed, Trained, and in a fuitable posture and readings for the ends atorclaid; and that every Perlon may know his duty and be Obliged to perform the fame.

Be it therefore Enaced by His Extellency the Governoite, Council, and Regresentatives in General Court Atlembled, and it is Ordalized and Chaded by the Authority of the fame,

L.I.] That all Male Persons from Sixteen Years of Age to Sixty, Persons liable (other than such as are herein after Excepted) shall bear Arms and duely to Train. attend, all Multers and Military Exercises of the Respective Troops and Companies where they are litted or belong, allowing Three Moneths ... 1 time to every Son next after his coming to Sixtem years of Age; and every Servant, so long, after his time is out; to provide themselves with Arms and Ammunition &c.

g.a.; And the Clerk of each Troop and Company once a Quarter yearly shall take an Exact List of all Persons living within the Precincts Clerk to take of luch Troop or Company, and present the same to the Captain or a lift from Chief Officer, on pain of Forfeiting Fearty Shillings for each default, to be times a pear. paid to the Captain or Chief Officer to the use of the Company. And in cale of non payment, to be levied by diffress and fale of the Offenders goods, by vertue of a Warrant from the Captain or Chief Officer, who is hereby Impowred to grant the fame.

That every Person listed in any Troop or Company shall to Person continue and attend all duty in fuch Troop or Company, or otherwise attend duty fusier the Penalty by Law provided, until orderly dismist or removed our where lifted of the Town or Precinct, and in case of Removal into the Precinct's of till orderly another Company in the same Town, to produce a Certificus under the difmift. hand of the Captain or Chief Officer of the Precinet Whereve he is removed, that he is lifted there.

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Thinkelt by Shifting from boule to house or place to place, to avoid being Penalty on to lifted; he shall pay as a time for every such Offence, to the use of the fuch as shall Company to which he belongs Ten Shillings being Convicted before any Shift is a fulfile of Peace of the County. and liftime

75. That every lifted Souldier and other Houshokler (except Troopers) shall be alwayes provided with a well fixt Firelock Abuker, of Musker or Bellard Musker bore; The Barrel not less then three face and a balf long, or other good Fire Arms to the Satisfaction of the Commission Officers of the Company, a Snapfack, a Coller with Twelve Bardelers or Cartach-bex, one Pound of good Pender, Twenty Bullets fit for his Gun, and Twelve Flows, a good Sword or Cutlace, a Worm and Princing with fit for his Gun; on penalty of Six Shillings for want of fuch Arms as is hereby required, and Two Shillings for each other defect, and the like Sum for every four weeks he shall remain unprovided; the Fine to be paid by Parents for their Sons under Age and under their Command; and by Masters or heads of Families, for their Servanes, other than Servanes upon Wages.

506 That every Trooper shall be always provided with a good fervicable Herse of Free Pounds Value, and not less then Fourteen hands high, at Trespers bew (the same to be determined by the two Chief Commission Officers)
to be familiar Covered with a good Sadje, Bit, Bridle, Holfters, Petteral and Crooper; and tobe furnished with a Carbine, the Barrel nor less then two Foot and half long, with a Belt and Swivel, a case of good Pistels; with a Swerd or Cutlace, a Flask or Cartouch-box; one Pound of good Pounder, three Pounds of Sizeable Bullets, Twenty Flints, and a good Pair of Boots and Spirs; on penalty of Twelve Shillings for want of fuch Horse as is hereby ordered, and three Shillings a Piece for every other defect, and the like Sum for every Sixi A weeks he shall remain unprovided: and that each Trooper list his Horse, and shall not dispose thereof without the consent of his Chief Officer on the penalty of Free Pounds: And for non Appearance at the time and place appointed for Exercise, every listed Trooper for each dayes neglost shall pay Ten Shillings Fine.

> That there may be two Troops in a Regiment, each of which Troops shall flot Exceed Sixry men with Officers.

GART That Regimental Musters shall be but once in three years, (Except in 28011011)And every Captain or Chief Officer of any Com-Regimental play of Troop in any Regiment, shall be obliged on penalty of Five Muffers, & Person on draw forth his Company or Troop or cause them to be drawn Training of forth! For dayes Annually, and no more, to Exercise them in Motions, particular the use of Arms, and Shooting at Marks, or other Military Exercises, which Companies. every person liable to Train having bear duely Warned, and not appears ing, and avending the same, shall for each dayes neglect pay a Fino of the Five Shillings.

That the Committee Officers of any Company or Troop or the Major part of them, may order the Correcting and Punishing dif Comm orders and contempt on a featining day, or on a Watch, the Punishment Officers ponenot belog great then Lying Nack and Hock, Riding the Wooden Herfe, er. or Ten Shillings Line

\$ 10. That there he Military Watches appointed and kept in every Town at fuch times, in fuch places and in fuch Numbers, and under Aflicary fuch Regulations as the Chief Military Officers of each Town shall appoint, Watches. or as they may receive orders from the Chief Officer of the Regiment: And that all persons able of Body or that are of Estate (and not Exemped by Law) shall by themselves or some meet person in their stead, to the acceptance of the Commander of the Watch, attend the fame, on penalty of Five Shillings for each defect; there having been due Warming giving.

L. Every Souldier or other Person liable by Law, refusing or neglecting to attend Military Exercises, on Training dayes; or Military Watches that shall not pay, or have no Estate to be found whereon to Penalty levy the fine, it shall be in the power of the Captain, or Chief Officers not attending of such Company on the next Training day after such neglect (he not Military having fatisfied the Clerk) to punish him for such offence, by laying Exercises. Neck and Heels, or Riding the Wooden Horse, not exceeding one Hours time: And if such delinquent shall absent himself the second Training day, without giving fufficient reason to the Captain, or Chief Officers for the fame; it shall be in the power of the Chief Officer of the Company to direct a Warrant to the Constable of the Town, requiring him to apprehend fuch delinquent, and bring him into the Field, that he may be punishe according as by this Law is provided, and all Constables are hereby Required to Execute such Warrants accordingly.

Sec (\$12.) That the Persons hereafter Named be Exempted from all Trainings. Viz. The Members of the Council, the Representatives for the Persons Extime being, the Secretary, Justices of the Peace, President, Fellows, Students, Persons and Servants of Harvard Colledge Exempted by Colledge Charter, Masters of Training. Art, Ministers, Elders and Deacons of Churches, Sheriffs, allowed Phiscians, or Training, Chirurgions, and Profest School Masters, all such as have had Commissions, and Served as Field Officers, or Captains, Lieutenants, or Ensures, Coreners, Treasurers, Atturney General, Deputy-Sheriffs, Clerks of Courts, Constables, Constant Ferrymen, and one Miller to each Grift-Mill: Officers imployed in and about Their Majorties Revenues, all Masters of Vessels of Thirty Tuns and upwards, usually imployed beyond Sea, and constant Herdsmen, Lame Parties or otherwise disabled in Body (producing Certificate thereof from two able Chipurgions) Indians and Negros.

Litts. That twice every year or oftner if required every Captain or Chief Officer of each Company or Troop shall give order for a diligent enquiry into the flate of his Company, and for taking an liked Lift of the Names of his souldiers and Inhabitants within the Limits of his Company, and of the detects of Arms or otherwife, and Names of the defective Pertons, that they may be profecuted as the Law hath provided, and fuch care may be taken as is proper to remedy the fame.

That if any Person, who is by Law obliged to provide Arms and Ammunition, cannot purchase the same by luch means as he hath, How perfort if he being to the Clerk of the Company Corn or other Merchantable Provition, of vendible goods, so much as by Apprizement of the Clerk and unable to two other Persons mutually chosen, shall be judged of greater value Arm's may by one lifth part, than such Arms or Amunicion is of : he thereupon be provided. thall be Excused from the penalties for want of Arms and Ammunition. until he can be provided, which faid Clerk shall provide as soon as may be by Sale of fuch goods, and render the overplus to the parry if any be: But the party shall notwithstanding give his personal attendance upon all occasions as other Souldiers, until he be supplyed, and at such times shall perform any proper Service he may be put upon by the Captain or Chief Officer of the Company he belongs to; but if the person be judged unable to buy Arms, or to lay down the value proposed, if he be a fingle man, he shall be put out to Service, by the two next Justices of Peace, to carn wherewith ro-bny Arms and Ammunition; if fuch person have a Family and be judged unable, by the Captain and Major part of the Select men to lay down fuch value for the end aforelaid, then he shall be provided for out of the Town Stock, or by Arms procured at the Towns charge, until fuch time as he be judged able to provide for himfelf, and fuch Arms to be under the care of the Chief Military Officer and the Select men of the Town.
