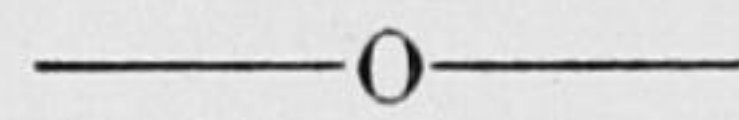
Injury to

SEC. 5. No person shall injure any boat, oar or tackling used for the conveyance of persons or property under a license from the city. It shall be the duty of the Harbor Master to enforce the provisions of this chapter.

SEC. 6. Any person violating any provision of either the third, fourth or fifth sections of this chapter shall, on conviction thereof, be fined in any sum not exceeding one hundred dollars.



## CHAPTER XXIII.

### FIRE-ARMS.

#### SECTION.

1. Firing of cannon, etc., within the city limits prohibited.
2. Construction; not to apply to military companies, shooting galleries, etc
3. Permission by Board of Improvements for Fourth of July.
4. Penalty.

#### SECTION.

5. Aiming fire-arms, without malice, towards any person; penalty.
6. Discharging same while aimed towards another; penalty.
7. Maiming or injuring by discharge of fire-arms pointed, etc., without malice, etc.; penalty.

SECTION 1. No person shall fire any cannon, gun, rifle, pistol or fire-arms of any kind, or fire or explode any squib, rocket, cracker, Roman candle, or other combustible fire-works within the city.

Construc-

SEC. 2. This ordinance shall not apply to any military company, when drilling under command of any officer thereof, or to the use of fire-arms in the lawful defense of the person, family or property of any person, or to the killing of any dog whose owner or possessor has not complied with the provisions of the ordinance relating to dogs, or to regular shooting galleries operated under permit from the Mayor.

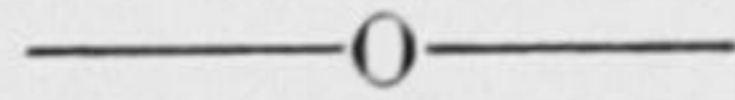
SEC. 3. The Board of City Improvements may, at its discretion, give permission to any person or persons to discharge fire-arms or fire-works, on the fourth day of July; such permission may be given through any public paper of the city, or otherwise.

SEC. 4. Any person violating any provision of this chapter shall, on conviction thereof, be fined in any sum <sup>Penalty.</sup> not exceeding twenty dollars.

SEC. 5. Any person who shall intentionally, without <sup>Aiming fire-arms at another.</sup> malice, point or aim any fire-arm at or toward any other person, shall be subject to a fine of not less than five <sup>Penalty.</sup> dollars, nor more than fifty dollars.

SEC. 6. Any person who shall discharge, without in- <sup>Discharging</sup> jury to any person, any fire-arm while intentionally without malice aimed at or toward any such person, shall be subject to a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars nor <sup>Penalty.</sup> more than one hundred dollars, or imprisonment in the workhouse not exceeding thirty days, or both, at the discretion of the court.

SEC. 7. Any person who shall maim or injure any <sup>Maiming</sup> other person by the discharge of any fire-arm pointed or aimed intentionally, but without malice, at any such person, shall be subject to a fine of not less than fifty dollars, <sup>Penalty.</sup> nor more than one hundred dollars, or imprisonment in the workhouse not exceeding ninety days, or both, at the discretion of the court.



## CHAPTER XXIV.

### FIRES.

#### SECTION.

1. Stove pipes to be conducted into chimney of brick or stone; ashes made in building to be kept in metallic vessel, etc.
2. Combustibles not to be placed within fifteen feet of where fire is kept; lighted candle near to be secured in lantern; permission of Fire Warden.
3. Setting fire to combustibles, or bonfires in street within two hundred feet of any building prohibited.
4. Shops containing shavings to be cleared three times a week, etc.
5. Combustible matter not to be thrown or scattered in street nor fire be carried through any street, etc., unless in a secure vessel.
6. Pipe holes in chimneys; how made and stopped.

#### SECTION.

7. Chimneys in buildings; how constructed, etc.
8. Height and material of certain chimneys.
9. Scuttles and stairways in certain buildings.
10. Mayor, Harbor Master or Fire Warden to direct as to location of vessels having combustible materials on board, etc; neglecting to obey orders; penalty.
11. Transportation of gun-powder.
12. Duty of Fire Wardens; occupants of premises to comply with orders.
13. Setting fire to building by the owner prohibited; penalty.
14. Penalty.
15. Proprietors of hotels, etc., to furnish means of escape to occupants.
16. Penalty.
