**AN ORDINANCE to prevent and punish certain misdemeanors.**

SECTION I. *Be it ordained by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Clifton,* That it shall be unlawful, except for persons in military array, or to enforce the laws, or in defence of person or property, to discharge any description of fire-arms within the corporate limits of the village.

SECTION II. That it shall be unlawful for any person, at any time, within the corporate limits of this village, to catch, kill or injure, or to pursue with such intent upon the premises of another, or on the highways, streets or public grounds, any sparrow, robin, blue bird, marten, thrush, mocking bird, cat bird, chewing or ground robin, king bird, bobolink, yellow bird, pewee or phoebe, wren, cuckoo, indigo bird, nut hatch, creeper, yellow hammer, flecker, warbler, or finch.

SECTION III. That it shall be unlawful for any person to go or enter upon the premises of another within the corporate limits of this village for the purpose of shooting, killing, catching or pursuing any quail, rabbit, hare or game of any kind, or while on such premises to kill, catch or pursue any such game without the consent of the owner of such premises.

SECTION IV. That it shall be unlawful for any person within the corporate limits of this village to play at marbles, town ball, or other games of sport, to shoot at a mark, or disturb the peace by discharging fire-arms on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday.



SECTION V. That the Marshal, or other police officers of this village, is hereby empowered to arrest on view, without warrant, any and all persons violating this ordinance or any of the provisions thereof.

SECTION VI. That any person violating the foregoing ordinance, or any of the provisions thereof, shall be fined in any sum not exceed one hundred dollars, or be imprisoned not more than ninety days, or both, at the discretion of the Court or Mayor.

**AN ORDINANCE to narrow Biddle Street.**

SECTION I. *Be it ordained by the Council of the Incorporated Village of Clifton,* That Biddle Street, in said village, be and the same is hereby narrowed to fifty feet in width, by vacating so much of said street as embraces a strip of land five feet wide on each side of said street, commencing at its intersection with Glenway
