CHAPTER XXVII.

OFFENSES AGAINST THE PUBLIC PEACE AND QUIET.

SECTION.

1. Noise riot or disturbance, penalty.
2. Disturbing religious meetings, penalty.
3. Indecent language, &c., penalty.
4. Abuse and annoyance of others, penalty.
5. Fast driving, penalty.
6. Soliciting alms, penalty.
7. Carrying deadly weapons, penalty.

SECTION 1. Any person who shall make, aid, or assist in making any improper noise, riot, or disturbance, breach of the peace in the streets, or elsewhere in the city, and all persons who shall collect in bodies or crowds, in the streets or on sidewalks, for unlawful purposes, or for any purpose to the annoyance or disturbance of citizens or travelers, shall be subject to a fine of not less than five dollars.

Noise, riot or disturbance in streets.

Penalty.

SEC. 2. Any person who shall disturb or disquiet any congregation or assembly met for religious worship, by making a noise, or by rude and indecent behavior, or profane discourse within their place of worship, or so near the same as to disturb the order and solemnity of the meeting, shall be subject to a fine in a sum of not less than five dollars.

Disturbing religious meetings.

Penalty.

SEC. 3. Any person who shall use any scandalous, obscene, lewd, filthy or otherwise indecent language to any other person, or of or concerning any other person in the hearing of others, or shall make any immodest, lewd, or other indecent sign or gesture, or commit any other immodest, lewd or indecent act to

Indecent language, &c.

Penalty. or in the known presence of any other person, shall on conviction thereof, be liable to a fine of not less than five dollars.

Abuse and annoyance of others. SEC. 4. Any person who shall wilfully conduct himself in a noisy, boisterous, rude, insulting or other disorderly manner, by either words or acts toward any other person, with intent to abuse or annoy such person, or so as to annoy the citizens of the city, or any portion thereof and disturb the good order and quiet of the same, shall, on conviction thereof, be liable to a fine of not less than five dollars.

Penalty.

Immoderate driving and riding. SEC. 5. Any person who shall immoderately drive or ride any horse, or other animal, in any avenue, street, alley, or lane, within the city, shall be liable to a fine of not less than two dollars.

Penalty.

Soliciting alms. SEC. 6. Any person who shall solicit alms in the city, for any purpose whatever, without permission from the mayor for that purpose, shall be liable to a fine of two dollars for the first offense and for each subsequent offense five dollars.

Penalty.

Carrying of deadly weapons. SEC. 7. Any individual who shall carry about his or her person any dirk, bowie knife, sword or spear cane, pistol, revolver, slung-shot, jemme, brass knuckles, or other deadly and unlawful weapon, or shall use any deadly or unlawful weapon, with intent to do bodily harm to any person or persons, shall be liable to a fine of not less than twenty-five dollars, and also to imprisonment not to exceed three months.

Penalty.

Ringling of gongs and bells. SEC. 8. Any person who shall ring any gong or bell in any street, lane or alley, or upon any sidewalk, or upon any piazza, step or platform immediately adjoining any sidewalk, lane or alley in the city of
