# AN ACT

## Establishing the Borough of Naugatuck

GENERAL ASSEMBLY,  
JANUARY SESSION, A.D. 1893.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives, in  
General Assembly convened:*

\* Section 1. All such portion of the town of Naugatuck \*  
as is embraced and included within and by the following  
limits and lines, to wit: Commencing at a point in the high-  
way, known as the Millville road, twenty-four feet westerly  
of the southwest corner of Newell A. Smith's barn at an iron  
pin on the northerly side of the said highway; thence in a  
straight line south two degrees, fifteen minutes east (mag-  
netic) to an iron pin on the northerly line of the highway  
leading to Andrews hill, and about fifteen hundred and thir-  
ty-four feet westerly as the highway runs from Dooley's  
barn; thence southeasterly in a straight line to an iron pin  
located on the easterly side of the highway leading to Hoad-  
ley Mountain, so called, and north forty-seven degrees, ten  
minutes west, and two hundred and sixteen feet distant  
from southwest corner of an old barn belonging to Edward  
Hard; thence easterly in a straight line to the northwest  
corner of Grove cemetery, on the road leading to Beacon  
Falls; thence northeasterly in a straight line to an iron pin  
on the westerly side, and opposite a sluice in the highway  
leading to Hopkins hill, and about one hundred and sixty  
feet southwest from the house of Frederick Webber; thence  
northerly in a straight line to an iron pin in the railing on  
the north side of the highway leading to Prospect, and  
ninety-seven and one-half feet east from the northeast cor-  
ner of Edwin F. Smith's engine-house; thence northwesterly  
in a straight line to an iron pin in the easterly line of the  
highway leading to Waterbury, and about one hundred and



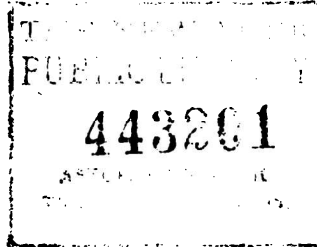

*Be it Ordained by the Board of Warden and Burgesses of the Borough  
of Naugatuck:*

**SECTION 1.**

**CLAUSE 1.** All ordinances, by-laws, rules and regulations heretofore made by the Board of Warden and Burgesses, and recorded in the book of by-laws of the borough, are hereby rescinded and repealed. This clause shall not go into effect until the following sections numbered 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10 and 11 shall become valid and operative.

**CLAUSE 2.** No person shall gain any prescriptive or perpetual rights by reason of any permit or permission heretofore or hereafter granted by the Board of Warden and Burgesses or any official of the Borough, and all such permits or permission may be revoked, canceled or rescinded by a majority vote at any legal meeting of said Board.

**CLAUSE 3.** The warden may cancel any permit granted under the ordinances or by-laws of the borough whenever the operation under such a permit become unlawful or a nuisance.

AN ORDINANCE OR BY-LAW RELATING TO  
PUBLIC SAFETY.

*Be it Ordained by the Board of Warden and Burgesses of the Borough  
of Naugatuck:*

SECTION 2.

CLAUSE 1. No person shall discharge any pistol, revolver, gun, cannon or other firearm, or air gun in any street, park or public ground; *provided*, that this clause shall not apply to the use of such weapons in lawful defense of the person, family or property of anyone, or in the performance of any duty required by law.

CLAUSE 2. No person shall set fire to, discharge, keep, sell or expose for sale any fire cracker, rocket or other fireworks, except at such times and under such conditions as may be designated by the Warden or Board of Warden and Burgesses and the statute law of this state.

CLAUSE 3. No person shall keep or expose for sale any fire crackers, rockets or other fireworks within the limits of any street, highway or public grounds within the limits of the Borough.

CLAUSE 4. No person shall expose for sale or other purpose any fire cracker, rocket or other fireworks on or in any private premises without permission from the Warden, who may designate the conditions under which such permission may be granted.

CLAUSE 5. No person shall carry on his person within the limits of the borough any firearm, brass or metal kuckles, slung shot or similar weapon without permission from the Warden.

CLAUSE 6. No person shall expose or use any sling for firing or throwing any substance, within the limits of any street, highway or public ground in the borough.

CLAUSE 7. No person shall willfully ring or cause to be rung in, any false alarm of fire within the borough.

CLAUSE 8. No person shall manufacture, sell, deal in, procure, transport or use any compound more explosive than gunpowder within the limits of the borough of Naugatuck without first obtaining a license therefor as required by the statute laws of this state.

Any person offending against any clause of this section shall, on conviction, pay a penalty for the use of the Borough of a sum of not less than five nor more than fifty dollars.
