By request of the City Marshal, we again publish a few sections of the City Ordinances. Mr. Hartsock does not intend to go beyond the limits of the law, but he does intend to force law in all cases where it may be violated, and that to the fullest extent:

Art. 1.—Sec. 2. Whoever shall in this City, disturb the peace of others in violent, tumultuous or offensive conduct, or by loud and unusual noise, or by uncleanly, profane or obscene language calculated to provoke the breach of peace, or by assaulting, striking or frightening another, or whoever shall in this City, permit any such conduct in or upon any house or premises owned by them, or under their control, so that others in the vicinity are disturbed thereby, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

Art. 2.—Sec. 1. Whoever shall in this City, be found in a state of intoxication in any highway, thoroughfare or other public places, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec. 2. No person shall in this City, wear on or about his person any pistol, revolver or any other dangerous or deadly weapon, except by special permission from the Mayor, and whoever shall violate this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof shall be fined not less than five nor more than ten dollars. Provided however that this section shall not be construed as to prevent any United States, State, County or City officer from carrying such weapons as may be necessary in the proper discharge of his duties.

Sec. 3. No person shall in this City, discharge any gun, pistol or other firearms except as an officer of the City in the discharge of his duties. Any person violating this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.

Sec. 4. Any person who shall in this City stack or pile any hay, straw or other combustible material to remain stacked on blocks 67, 68, 69, 79, 80 and 81 shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor. Provided however that this section shall not be construed to prevent storing hay and straw in buildings.

Sec. 5. Any person who shall build or cover any stable, shed or other buildings with hay, straw or other combustible material on blocks 67, 68, 69, 79, 80 and 81 shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.
